

BUS / COACH INSTRUCTOR - COURSE CONTENT AND OVERVIEW

The Bus / Coach Instructor course provides candidates with the skills necessary to prepare drivers for the DVSA driving tests, to deliver Driver CPC training, and to carry out post-assessment/incident remedial training. Courses are available at the RTITB Instructor Academy in Telford, UK, on your site, or as remote Instructor training for the theory element of the course.

BY THE END OF THE BUS / COACH INSTRUCTOR COURSE CANDIDATES WILL:

- Be able to plan and deliver PCV/PSV training
- Be able to recall and discuss the responsibilities of a Bus / Coach Instructor
- Be able to explain the content and objectives of the PCV/PSV driving test.

All candidates must successfully complete an independent examination to qualify as an RTITB Instructor – an internationally recognised qualification.

- Have a valid category D entitlement for 3 years or more
- Have significant experience as a professional PCV/PSV driver

The Bus / Coach Instructor course covers the following core topics:

EXAMINATION:

At the end of the course, an examiner from RTITB will conduct the following 4-part exam.

1. Part 1: multiple choice theory test

- 60 questions
- 85% overall pass mark and 80% in each of the following areas: instructional techniques, legislation, highway code, safe driving and DVSA testing

2. Part 2: Practical Driving Ability Test

- No more than 6 driving faults
- No serious or dangerous
- Successfully complete one off-road and an explanation exercise

3. Part 3: in-cab training delivery test

- Deliver training for a new skill 33/47 pass mark
- Remedial Training for a candidate suffering skill fade 27/39 pass mark
- Demonstration drive & commentary (post-test failure) 51/73 pass mark

4. Part 4: in-class training delivery test

84/120 pass mark
